

Behind the power of their playing...

Who would have thought that the mythical Murray character of DIO artwork is an actual real being who lurks in the backline every time a DIO song is performed.

Extraordinary creative powers!

Are they supernatural, divine... or possessed by superior power?

The backgrounds of the DIO players is diverse. It may be a surprise to learn that they not only began DIO, but were essential in many other bands as well.

DIO essentially also includes drummer Simon Wright, also very well- known for his AC/DC years.

Throughout the years there have been many musicians who played music with Ronnie. None of them unheard of or under-appreciated.

DIO began in 1982 ...

What a year, after going through heck with Black Sabbath and the Live Evil album, [Vinny Appice](#) decided to leave the band with Ronnie. The inception of an epoque, the metal super group DIO...! Vivian Campbell (guitar) and Jimmy Bain (bass).

"It was a good time to be in that band. It was perfect for us. Everything just fell into place. The ethic in rehearsal was amazing. The effort in the recording was just as good. Everybody wanted it to be great. We really believed in what we were doing and couldn't wait to get that product out and have people hear it." - from [RJD interview '08]

What is it that has empowered Vinny Appice's playing, a true artist who has in fact shaped metal history with every band he's ever been in, drumming rhythms that are beyond belief cool. Without a doubt under the influence of not any ordinary beings... for a long time now.

If given the opportunity to speak with him again, I will ask for Murray's direct contact info. In fact, I wouldn't be surprised if Murray has his own office somewhere on Wilshire Blvd... *(Let's see, should I give him the opportunity to hang up on me?)*

The mastermind of metal vocalist DIO, the bedrock drumlines of Vinny Appice, the golden friendship of guitar player Craig Goldy, the amazing Scott Warren on keys, a favorite of course is impressive bass guitar player Rudy Sarzo, whose expressive riffs and solos make the world turn!

RJD is greatly appreciated by many musicians including bands as well known as Metallica, they can be found on his "This is Your Life" CD released last year.

The genesis of Murray, the demonic human-like being Ronnie found in the forest...

RONNIE JAMES DIO frequently returned to the place deep in the forest where he would meet "MURRAY". During these visits, he would bring the giant up to date on world events and so on. "MURRAY" would delight Ronnie of stories of what he remembered from when the Earth was young, and Ronnie would go home and write songs about them. As a tribute to his new friend, Ronnie asked if he could put "MURRAY" on the front covers of his solo albums, and "MURRAY", quite flattered, agreed. - *(Story as told told by Heidi Robinson)*

Why are most people afraid of Murray? The band DIO wouldn't know- they fear nothing.

DIO passed away in '10, and it wasn't long before someone had a brilliant idea, to form the power group **DIO Disciples**... DIO is alive in spirit! We know that DIO can be found right there with his players in spirit every time his music is heard- *(unless he's cavorting about somewhere with Murray...)*. The new band has been formed by original DIO band members, and his part has been sung by others such as Tim Ripper Owens. Ripper has done a fantastic job doing most of the singing for the band- and as I understand will be performing with the group again this year. Not easy shoes to fill!

Hellion '82, the LA band still rocks!

The story of Anne Boleyn - was it the 16th century when it all began with rolling heads?

Nowadays, Anne often appears at the Ultimate jam at **Lucky Strike!**

Believe it or not, it was the 1980's when she was ousted by her very own band and nearly had to start all over again. She kept her own image and the name Hellion, the rest of the players began the band Burn... Can you believe they had found it suitable to dethrone her? Unbelievable!

Hellion has had new members over time and maybe we'll see more changes yet- always exciting and fantastic. Officially the band includes metal vocalist Anne, guitarist Maxwell Carlisle, and DIO players bassist Bjorn Englen, keyboardist Scott Warren, and drummer Simon Wright.

Heaven and Hell ...

This was the second of three albums that Dio recorded with the group black Sabbath (Geezer Butler, Tony Iommi, Bill Ward) while he was singing replacing Osbourne. This album went Silver in 1982...

This band was the reunion of the original lineup which played from '80-'82, including

[Ronnie James Dio – lead vocals, keyboards (2006–2010) Tony Iommi – guitar (2006–2010) Geezer Butler – bass (2006–2010) Vinny Appice – drums, percussion (2006–2010)

Scott Warren – keyboards, guitar (offstage) (2007–2010) Glenn Hughes – lead vocals (2010) Jørn Lande – lead vocals (2010)]

The band was reunited for about 4 years before Ronnie's death.

I have heard rumors that another fantastic vocalist, Joe Retta will be performing Heaven and Hell once again...

Phenomenal vocalists, with voices straight from above! There are many who have been inspired by DIO, and who perform his music. His wonderful voice and personality has filled so many hearts that we are all inspired to ROCK!

Dio Memorial weekend 2015, an inspiring delight...!

It couldn't have been better, a very marvelous series of events that included a showcase of heartfelt tribute songs to Ronnie that were performed at the Forest Lawn Memorial center.

Remembering the music and the band Dio, both past and present. 
I would like to include many of the words that were said about Ronnie James Dio when I spoke with the players:

Hek82: Hey, I'm Hek82 w/Anaheim radio... I can't believe that I'm standing in front of Lita Ford!

Lita Ford: It is a great pleasure *(with aristocratic accent)!*

Hek82: Fantastic! Well, we're here this weekend to celebrate the life of RJD, and so many wonderful world famous singers like you who have been influenced by him, are there any thoughts you can share with us?

Lita Ford: There's nobody like Ronnie. We're here to fight cancer and the fact that Ronnie is who he is, and the mark that he's made in the music industry is huge! He started years ago and I was a kid and I was listening to Stargazer. It was a bad-ass song on the radio, and there



was no other song that could kick-that-ass! Uh- Cozy Powell, and Ritchie Blackmore ... C'mon- they're the best of the best!

Hek82: Absolutely, these are treasured memories- growing up and hearing some of these songs ... it's a wonderful and I'm just happy to be a part of this weekend and the history that you rock-n-roll stars have made happen!

Lita Ford: We all hold our own torch in the music industry, and Ronnie can never be replaced. A lot of people have tried and he has influenced so many people including myself, we love him! We would do anything for him and his team.

Hek82: We love Ronnie, and the spirit lives on.. the music lives on!

Lita Ford: Yeah!



Hek82: Thank you.

Lita Ford: Absolutely.

Hek82: Hello! Can you introduce your band for my radio show...

Great White: This is Mark Kendall, Michael Lardie, Scott Snyder, Audie Desbrow, Terry Llou ... you're from Anaheim? That's where Great White kinda started out!

Hek82: And now I'm with Gabbie Rae! If you want to introduce yourself, or talk a lil' bit about Ronnie James Dio that would be great.

Gabbie Rae: My name is Gabbie Rae and I'll be 17 in 5 days... I grew up listening to Ronnie's music. You know, my Dad is

completely stuck in the 80s and I grew up on all the best music and Ronnie is one of those artists. So, I grew up listening to this and now it's amazing to be older and be able to be involved with Ronnie's legacy- it's amazing!

Hek82: Thank you. It is nice to be here and be able to be a part of the celebration of his lifetime of work and music.

G- Rae: Thank you so much!

Hek82: Hello, you're you! Rock Feinstein from the band Elf which I love!

Rock: Thank you very much.

Hek82: I had so much fun putting together a line up of songs for my radio show, and Elf is part of it. Would you like to share with us what that was like being a member of the band Elf together with Ron.

Rock: The band Elf was great you know because it was before all the corporate stuff, it was a real band. We put all the songs together, some were written individually; but just good camaraderie within the band. There was something special about the make-up of that band.

Hek82: Thanks!

Hek82: Happy to meet you ... an accomplished musician here... it is-

Dave Alford: Dave Alford. It's the band Rough Cutt!

Hek82: I confess I'm not all too familiar... Were you lucky enough to have known Ronnie?

Dave Alford: Yes, there wouldn't even have been a band Rough Cutt if it weren't for Ronnie. His wife Wendy was our manager for 6 years.

Hek82: I am definitely going to play Rough Cutt on my radio show! I'm going to check it out!

Dave Alford: We're looking forward to doing the Memorial show tomorrow...

Hek82: I'm really excited that I'm going to get the chance to hear it. I wish you all the best with your group, I'll be there tomorrow!

Dave Alford: Thank you!

Hek82: Say- something you can share about RJD?

Tom Morello: I am a huge fan of everything Ron ever did... all of his bands, his work with Black Sabbath was when I first heard of him. I thought it was going to be very difficult for anyone to replace Ozzy Osbourne. He did it in such a way that continued the awesomeness of Sabbath and taking it to a new place which was great! I'm a huge fan of his solo work, he was always a gentleman, and stood up for hard rock and heavy metal in a very unapologetic way.

Hek82: Super description of him. It's nice of you to share with us today. What bands are you playing with now?

Tom Morello: Well, I played for about two years with Bruce Springsteen, and now I'm making a big rock solo record.

Hek82: Oh, cool! I'm definitely looking forward to hearing any new music that you might come out with, wow!

Tom Morello: It's an honor to be a part of any event that's got Ronnie James Dio's name attached to it, especially if it's a charity event like this, doin' something good for people.

Hek82: Thank you very much.

Tom Morello: I appreciate it, thank you.

Hek82: A player from Trans-Siberian Orchestra!

Jeff Scott Soto: Yes, I've been touring with Trans Siberian for 8 years now.

Hek82: Wow! What an accomplished style of music... admirable! I spoke with Joel Hoekstra not long ago...

Jeff Scott Soto: Joel's great!

Hek82: You guys are so fantastic and I am so happy to have the opportunity to meet you. We're here for Dio and we're here for the Stand Up and Shout cancer fund. Is there anything you might want to share? How has Dio's music impacted you?

Jeff Scott Soto: Well, Ronnie was not just one of the greatest singers of all time, he was a pioneer. His legacy was built on everything he was giving us, even as up-and-coming artists. He laid a whole foundation for heavy metal singing. And it's kinda funny today when you see Taylor Swift in one direction giving up the horns, they don't realize where that came from. It's a testament to what that guy left behind.

Hek82: Yeah! Well, thank you so much for sharing.

Jeff Scott Soto: Thank you.

Hek82: Gentlemen!

Stone Sour: Hi, my name is Roy Mayorga and I play drums in Stone Sour.

Stone Sour: My name is Christian Martucci, I play guitar!

Hek82: Stone Sour, I love your music, and I'm playing it on my weekly radio show. Would you like to talk about how the music of Dio influenced your playing style.

Stone Sour: Well, for me it was his incredible ear for finding some of the greatest guitar players, everybody from Vivian Campbell, Craig Goldy, to Rowan Robertson. Those guys were a huge influence on me- those were some of the first records that I ever heard and I love the songs.

He's the Pavoratti of metal!

Hek82: Alright! His vocals are unbeatable.

Stone Sour: His vocals are larger than life. There'll never be another one like him.

Hek82: Okay, I hope you enjoy the weekend and have a wonderful time at these activities here. Nice to see your band is represented. I am just happy to be partaking in it.

Stone Sour: Thank you very much.

Hek82: Hello, Brian Tichy! How's it goin'?

Brian Tichy: Very good, I'm psyched to be here.

Hek82: Well, we're here to celebrate the life of RJD, can you share something?

Brian Tichy: Insanely amazing singer. One of the best of all time, in rock and beyond. I was in 8th grade when I heard the Mob Rules and was getting my ass-kicked by RJD. I've met him and got pictures with him, a bunch of years ago. I love DIO, so anytime they have an event organized, I'm here! I love his music, I love his voice and he's inspirational.

Hek82: Thanks for being here. Tell me, are you going on tour with Dead Daisies now?

Brian Tichy: They have some stuff planned for the end of the year. I'm doing an Australia tour! I'll be in Europe with Whitesnake. Next week we've got three Bonzo bashes and two Randy Rhoads Remembered on the East coast! So, we have been busy getting that all together.

Hek82: Are you going on RRR tour as well?

Brian Tichy: Well, that's my show Bonzo Bash/ RRR, I play drums all night and put the shit together. Thousands of hours of organization!

Hek82: Thanks Brian, and enjoy the weekend!

Hek82: (Scott Warren) - I have a radio show called Hek! I know you were a close personal friend of Ron's and of course worked with him for so many years... Your keyboard playing is brilliant. Very nice to meet you. Is there anything you can share about the Memorial weekend?

Scott Warren: Honored to be a part of the weekend, I don't take that for granted. It's a little overwhelming. You see, Ronnie had such a vast family! Very well-planned event, a brilliant idea that Wendy had.

Hek82: He certainly does, it's nice to be here with many of his friends and so many musicians.

Scott Warren: There are a lot that wanted to be here and couldn't make it. Players from the Scorpions, Motorhead, Iron Maiden... they're all working or on the road so they couldn't attend.

Hek82: Okay, Scott! I look forward to hearing you play with the bands Dio Disciples, Hellion, or whatever you're up to please let me know!

Scott Warren: Okay, Kate

Hek82: Anne Boleyn from Hellion- how are you tonight?

Anne Boleyn: I'm doin' awesome, how're you doin'?

Hek82: Very good , thank you. It's a great event. It's gonna' be a fun weekend. What's new with Hellion? I'm gonna play your music on my show...

Anne Boleyn: We did a north American tour a few months back, Karma's a bitch tour in support of the new EP... then we just got back from Chicago where we did an awesome sold out show at the Arcada theatre with Quiet Riot..., right now we are mixing tracks together for our live album. So, writing new stuff, getting ready to go over to England... And- we just got announced for the Monsters of Rock Cruise in 2016.

Hek82: Ooo, you are lucky! And you're playing with some of the original Dio players so you are one lucky chick!

Anne Boleyn: I'm freaking out to be standing on the stage and have such an awesome band!

Hek82: Well Anne, you are a phenomenal performer and a great singer. I recently got into Hellion and I love the sound. It's just classic metal sound. Good hard rock. So, thank you for being here and is there something you would like to say about Dio?

Anne Boleyn: Just wanted to say that Hellion as a band, right from the beginning we worked with Ronnie. He was definitely a mentor and a huge influence on what we do. The loss of him was a tremendous loss to the whole metal community. Not only the music community but he was a very kind person.

Hek82: Well, thank you for sharing that. It is wonderful to hear from people who actually knew and worked with Ronnie and it's wonderful to be a part of the event.

Anne Boleyn: Wonderful to be a part of it. Thank you so much.

Hek82: Good evening!

Jeff Scott Soto: ... the guy who actually engineered the record had misconceptions about what it was gonna be like, and Ronnie came in everyday 110% pro! He could just turn it into a new perspective, and I knew what Ronnie was about- he was so together and so great, he did everything that he did with incredible class, style, and an incredible work ethic.

Hek82: He certainly did have a lot of class and style. I like the way you describe him, as well as all of his friends, I understand that he was just a really wonderful person.

Jeff Scott Soto: He was involved with charities since the mid- 80s.

Hek82: So, it was a pleasure to work with him. As far as musical styles- how would you say that your music was influenced by him?

Jeff Scott Soto: The energy of what he did was more what influenced me because I grew up listening to a lot of Blues artists. Dio brought so much energy to his every performance that you can't help but have it were off on you. Some of the stuff that he did with Rainbow, I was just completely blown away. Those records like Rainbow Rising, those songs withstood the test of time. Ritchie Blackmore was one of my favorite guitar players, so when he got together with Ritchie Blackmore I was like- oh, my God the sky's the limit! His voice and that guitar... he just never did anything that wasn't like really good, you know! You gotta appreciate everything he puts into what he does. Very big influence on me.

Hek82: Thank you so much!

Hek82: I'm here with Craig Goldy, and we are honoring and celebrating Ronnie's memory this weekend. Craig, you were very close to Ronnie as were a lot of people, and we're here to support the Stand Up and Shout cancer Fund. Is there something that you would like to share about RJD?

Craig Goldy: Well, I think that not a lot of people really knew just how kind of a human being he really was. there were times, and I know this personally, when he would go out of his way; for me- in the middle of recording Holy Diver, he had stopped because he knew something bad was happening to me; and he wanted to make sure we could take care of it. I remember understanding why it was he would do something like that, it was just because he was so kind. The way he would treat his fans. This foundation is also being run in a similar fashion. Because its not just throwing money at a bunch of guys in lab coats, going into a laboratory and seeing what they come up with. There's a lot of stuff that happens that people don't even know about. It's face-to-face, eye-to-eye, hand-to-hand. If somebody can't afford to get screened, they get screened. If they can't afford treatment, they can now afford treatment. Sometimes they don't get the best treatment in their local area, so they go to a different state. You know, that is paid for. The family members are respected face-to-face. It's not like, "Look at us raising a bunch of money and how great we are!" That's why this is important. So, there are a lot of charities out there that make money and send it out without doing anything.

Hek82: Well, I'll just add that you have done so much personally, through guitar. The bands that you have played with - Dio, and Dio Disciples, amazing. You're guitar playing is fantstic. The original Dio line up is here tonight and Craig is one of them. You're a phenomenal

player. I just wanted to add that the healing powers of rock-n-roll are strong indeed! That always will live on and it's people like you that make that happen.

Craig Goldy: Thank you for that.

Hek82: Well, thank you! I know you'll be playing this weekend and I'm really looking forward to that. Is there anything else you want to add?

Craig Goldy: We're good, thanks!

Hek82: (Tenacious D) Hey! I'm so happy to celebrate the life of RJD this weekend, and what he did for metal... I know you've been rollin' on tour, what's happenin'?

Kyle Gass and Jack Black: Look at that microphone attachment!

Hek82: I really like your music a lot and I think you're great players You are so funny, and your lyrics are a riot!

Jack Black: Thank you.

Hek82: You are prolific, you have lot of albums!

Jack: We have three!

Kyle: Is that a lot thought we had at least five! We should have more. We've got little bits and pieces around that are on the albums.

Jack: We've got The Last in Line!

Hek82: What have you been up to with the Kyle Gass group?

Kyle: Well, we just toured Europe. We're gonna go back and play some festivals in August, and you know- try to take over Europe!

Hek82: I hope you'll come to our area. LA or Orange county!

Kyle: Oh yeah, we will!

Hek82: I want to ask you about Tenacious D- that's Dio!

Jack: What does Tenacious D have to say about Dio? Still the greatest heavy metal vocalist of all time! After all these years...

Hek82: Well, he's tenacious! The movie you made says it all...

Jack: Thank you, it's true.

Hek82: So, you met and recorded with him, and it's great.

Jack: I don't think we could have done that movie without Ronnie. The truth is, it was the best part of the movie is Ronnie's cameo. It just crushes it. It's in evidence if you look at the You Tube hits on that particular scene. It's got ten million more hits than any other scene from the movie.

Hek82: I love the part where he comes out of the poster.

Jack: It's pretty bad ass! He's a tremendous actor too.

Hek82: Well, thank you guys! I was actually on a TV special when your movie first came out. It was a Halloween, Tenacious D sponsored it.

Jack: Nice!

Hek82: Yes, they threw Picks of Destiny all over the yard! I still have some.

Jack: Oh, my God that's very cool.

Hek82: I hope to see and hear more from you soon.

Jack: Yeah, we'll see you later!

Hek82: Thank you!

Simon Wright: Hi, Kate!



Hek82: Hello, Simon! I love this drummer ... Your performances as a drummer are always jsut great, it's always a joy to see you play.

Simon Wright: Thank you!

Hek82: How've you been doing? I know you've been playing with Geoff Tate's Queensryche...

Simon Wright: Yes, I do play with Geoff Tate, the new band is called Operation Mindcrime. We have a new album coming out towards the end of the year. There were two drummers on it, me and Brian Tichy from Whitesnake; because there's so much material. What he did was that he wrote a bunch of songs- it's gonna be a trilogy. So, that's where that's at; and my other bands are obviously Dio Disciples- (and Hellion) I have so many bands!

Hek82:Well, Dio Disciples is certainly an important group. RJD has touched so many lives, and you of course knew him personally and were lucky enough to have been in Dio. Is there something you might want to share about knowing Ronnie?

Simon Wright: We did other stuff besides music, and it was relief to do that... we used to work on his house and stuff. I was going through a really bad divorce and I didn't know what to do, I was thinking of going back to England and quittin' the band. He said "No, no! Just come stay at my house, I've got plenty of room you know..." It ended up being about 5-6 years, or longer. So, while we were hanging around and beer drinking we would say "maybe that wall needs fixing..." You know, because I was in construction before I was a drummer... it wasn't a threshold but we would knew what might need fixing. We'd go down to home Depot when we needed something. It was a really organic way of getting to know one another

Hek82: So, was it like hammer and nails... heavy metal?

Simon Wright: Not really! More like an escape from the music, the furthest thing!

Hek82: That was like recreation.

Simon Wright: Recreation, exactly. It worked out well, we would kind of look ourselves like- oh, our friend Steve would come in every other week and look at what we'd done. Steve used to look after Ronnie on the road for a long time, and he had said "You guys need tee-shirts!

Want to have a bad-ass time at the movies? Watch Hell and Back! A new animated story about a guy who enters into a contract with the devil, over a silly breathe mint- who could imagine! Killer animated characters and incredible pictorial scenes, c'mon have a good laugh over a



You need caps or somethin'". So the next month he came back with the caps and shirts, and we said "we need to take over the valley here- we're a real consolidated building firm!" And we really thought about that. He was gonna give up singing, and we were gonna become a construction firm. And I said "No, Ron! You need to keep singing!"

Hek82: Oh, my! What a story!

Simon Wright: So, I actually have a cap from a company called Si-Ron, which is what Steve named us. Ronnie was fantastic, always like a brother! We're just regular guys... and he just happened to be a brilliant singer!

Hek82: Brilliant is a good word for it! His voice is phenomenal to listen to. And what a great group of guys you are... the band Dio that made history with the songwriting withstanding the tests of time... alive in spirit!

Simon Wright: The whole basis for this situation with everyone loving him... is that he was a very genuine person, he would tell you when something was wrong- or it was funny...

Hek82: A very genuine and kind person!

Simon Wright: This is a really great thing that we're doing. To put things in perspective though, now that he's no longer with us- he was a really great and talented songwriter and singer... Great job, Kate!
